Metropolitan Tikhon, seminary deans, guests of Malankara Church

KOTTAYAM, KERALA, INDIA – At the invitation of His Holiness, Catholicos Baselios Marthoma Paulose II of the Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church, His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon, delivered an address at the 200th Anniversary of the Orthodox Theological Seminary here November 26, 2015.

Traveling with Metropolitan Tikhon were Archpriest Dr. Steven Voytovich, Dean of Saint Tikhon's Seminary, and Archpriest Dr. John Behr, Dean of Saint Vladimir's Seminary. In recent years,

the Orthodox Church in America has developed a strong relationship with the Malankara Church in North America through its seminaries, at which many Malankarese clergy and lay leaders have studied. Metropolitan Zachariah is a member of Saint Vladimir's Seminary Board of Trustees, while two Malankarese clergy, Priest M. K. Kuriakose and Priest Dr. Varghese M. Daniel, serve on the faculties of Saint Tikhon's and Saint Vladimir's seminaries respectively.

Metropolitan Tikhon also spoke at ceremonies in remembrance of the seminary's founder, Metropolitan Joseph Mar Dionysius, and at events marking the opening of the Sopana Academy for Studies in Theology and Culture.

Metropolitan Tikhon prays at French Embassy

WASHINGTON, DC – On November 14, 2015, His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon visited the French Embassy here to pay respect to those who lost their lives as a result of the multiple terrorist attacks on Paris, France one day earlier.

"On behalf of the Orthodox Church in America, I offer my condolences to the people of France, to the citizens of Paris, and to the President for this terrible tragedy endured in the land of France," said Metropolitan Tikhon in English and



French. "We offer our prayers that indeed such events will cease and that people will come to reason and to understand that life is important and death accomplishes nothing, certainly not senseless death."

On the same day, the Assembly of Canonical Orthodox Bishops of the USA issued a statement on the attacks.

"Year to date, through September 30, 2015, expenses were under budget by \$107,054.00," Ms. Ringa noted. "Total revenues for the same period were under budget by only \$18,856.00, representing slightly lower assessments and lower Chapel and Continuing Ed revenues." Orthodox end-of-life resources now available

SYOSSET, NY – In early November, the Orthodox Church in America's Department of Christian Service and Humanitarian Aid [CSHA] released resources addressing end-of-life issues from the Orthodox Christian perspective.

"While the Department has provided related materials for years, there seemed to be a gap in resources to guide Orthodox Christians in making faith-informed decisions," said Donna Karabin, CSHA Chair.

"A Gift For My Loved Ones" contains everything necessary to know should one become disabled or incapacitated and unable to make decisions on one's own. It includes a Health Care Power of Attorney and Advance Directive for Health Care/Living Will. A companion resource, "Another Gift For My Loved Ones," includes a wealth of necessary information concerning funerals and burial – an Advance Directive for Funeral Care.

SVOTS awarded \$250K Luce Foundation Grant

YONKERS, NY – On November 20, 2015, the Henry Luce Foundation announced that a \$250,000.00 grant has been awarded to St. Vladimir's Seminary here to fund a three-year study of the Sacred Arts. Through a series of conferences, workshops, and seminars to be held in the fall of 2016 through the spring of 2018, the grant will allow seminary faculty to survey the current state of Sacred Arts and explore the distinctive contribution Orthodox theology can make within it. Dr. Peter C. Bouteneff, SVOTS Professor of Systematic Theology, and Deacon Evan Freeman, doctoral candidate in the History of Art at Yale University and Lecturer in Liturgical Art at the seminary, will direct the series.

The grant award was given through the Henry Luce Foundation's Theology Program, which aims to "advance understanding of religion and theology" through projects that "cross religious, disciplinary, and geographic borders," and through support for "scholarship that is theoretically sophisticated, historically informed, critically reflexive, and practically invested.
