

OCA seminaries honor over 40 graduates

Over 40 seminarians were honored at commencement exercises at the Orthodox Church in America's seminaries in May 2016.

On Saturday, May 28, during the annual Pilgrimage to Saint Tikhon's Monastery, South Canaan, PA, His Eminence, Archbishop Demetrios of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, delivered the commencement address at Saint Tikhon's Seminary. Three seminarians received Master of Divinity degrees. Certificates in Pastoral Studies and Diaconal Formation were awarded to three additional students. His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon, presented a Doctor of Divinity, *Honoris Causa*, to Archbishop Demetrios.

Metropolitan Tikhon presided at commencement exercises at Saint Vladimir's Seminary, Yonkers, NY on Saturday, May 21. Thirteen graduates were awarded Master of Divinity degrees and 12 students received Master of Arts degrees. Four additional students received Master of Theology degrees. Dr. Paul Meyendorff, retiring Father Alexander Schmemann Professor of Liturgical Theology, delivered the commencement address and was awarded the Order of Saint Innocent, Silver Class, in recognition of his many years of service to the OCA and seminary.

On May 15, His Grace, Bishop David of Sitka and Alaska awarded diplomas to five graduates of Saint Herman's Seminary, Kodiak, AK. Two students received Clinical Pastoral Education and Reader Certificates. DALLAS, TX – Saint Seraphim Cathedral will be the site of the Enthronement of His Grace, Bishop Alexander as the second Bishop of Dallas and the South on Saturday, June 11, 2016. The greeting of His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon, followed by the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy and Rite of Enthronement, will begin at 9:00 a.m., followed by a banquet. On Friday evening, Vespers will be celebrated at 6:00 p.m. A reception will follow.

Grace, Bishop Andonios of Phasiane, Archdiocesan Chancellor; Archimandrite Nathanael Symeonides, Director of the Archdiocese's Office of Inter-Orthodox, Ecumenical and Interfaith Relations; and the Reverend Deacon Eleftherios Constantine, who met the OCA's Officers – Archpriest John Jillions, Chancellor; Archpriest Eric G. Tosi, Secretary; and Melanie Ringa, Treasurer – and Protopresbyter Leonid Kishkovsky, Director of External Affairs. Study resources available for Church History volume of Fr. Hopko's "The Orthodox Faith" series

SYOSSET, NY – While the late Protopresbyter Thomas Hopko was working on the revised edition of his four-volume series, *The Orthodox Faith*, he felt that adding discussion questions to the texts would enhance the books' usefulness. Subsequently, he requested members of the Department of Christian Education [DCE] to develop study resources/questions for each volume.

"Father Thomas especially wanted study resources for the History volume, as it is the most thoroughly revised and expanded, through his efforts and those of Dr. David C. Ford of Saint Tikhon's Seminary," said Matushka Valerie Zahirsky, DCE Chairperson. SVOTS Trustees implement new governance model

YONKERS, NY – The Board of Trustees of Saint Vladimir's Seminary voted in May 2016 to adopt a new governance model, headed by a newly defined Chief Executive Officer [CEO] position. The model became effective on May 27, with additional components to be implemented in the near future.

His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon, Board President, recognized "the excellent work undertaken by Board members over the past year as they worked with the Administration to tackle the challenging issues that are changing the environment in which the crucial work of theological education takes place."

The new model replaces the current bicameral system, headed by a Dean and a Chancellor/CEO, with four executive officers responsible for Academic Affairs, Operations, Advancement, and Finances, all of whom will report to a single CEO.
