Metropolitan Tikhon addresses World Summit in Defense of Persecuted Christians

WASHINGTON, DC – His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon offered welcoming remarks at the opening of "Martyrs for Christ," the World Summit in Defense of Persecuted Christians, May 10-13, 2017.

"This Summit takes place during the season of the resurrection of Christ, in which we celebrate the victory of the Life-giver over death and the destruction of corruption by the Divine Physician," said Metropolitan Tikhon. "As Christians, we

participate in this victory and this destruction not by the external imposition of force and violence upon others, but rather through our struggle to attain the love of Christ in the Holy Spirit, which is accomplished through humility and patience."

Also addressing the gathering was His Eminence, Metropolitan Hilarion [Alfeyev] of Volokolamsk, Chairman of the Moscow Patriarchate's Department for External Church Relations. On the Sunday after the Summit, Metropolitan Tikhon and Metropolitan Hilarion concelebrated the Divine Liturgy at the OCA's Saint Nicholas Cathedral in the US capital.

Sponsored by the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, the gathering considered the plight of persecuted Christians in 60 nations. Over 100 victims of persecution were among participants from 130 countries.

Accompanying Metropolitan Tikhon were His Grace, Bishop Daniel of Santa Rosa and Archpriests John Jillions and Eric G. Tosi, OCA Chancellor and Secretary respectively. Third annual OCA Mission School opens August 21

HUNTINGTON, NY – The third annual Mission School of the Orthodox Church in America will be held at Immaculate Conception Seminary here August 21-25, 2017. Each diocesan hierarch will select two participants – one clergy, one lay – to attend the program.

Among the topics that will be developed during the week-long gathering are Missiology and Evangelism Theory, Creating and Understanding a Mission's Vision, Community Building, Revitalizing a Parish, and Mission Community in Sacramental and Developmental Practice.

"The Mission School is an initiative of the Holy Synod of Bishops that utilizes a bequest to the OCA earmarked for missions and evangelism," said Archpriest Eric G. Tosi, OCA Secretary and Mission School Coordinator. OCA seminaries honor over three dozen graduates

Over three dozen seminarians were honored at commencement exercises at the Orthodox Church in America’s seminaries in May 2017.

On May 14, His Grace, Bishop David of Sitka and Alaska presented diplomas to Deacon Herman Madsen and Elena Levi during the 44th annual commencement exercises at Saint Herman’s Seminary, Kodiak, AK. Several other students were awarded Clinical Pastoral Education certificates. Archpriest David Shewczyk, Professor of Pastoral Theology at Saint Tikhon’s Seminary, South Canaan, PA, delivered the commencement address.

His Beatitude, Metropolitan Tikhon, Chair of Saint Vladimir’s Seminary Board of Trustees, presided at the 75th commencement exercises on the school’s Yonkers, NY campus on May 20. Sixteen graduates from three academic programs received degrees. His Grace, Bishop John of the Antiochian Archdiocese’s Diocese of Worcester and New England, delivered the commencement address, while the seminary’s trustees recognized Archpriest John Behr for his ten years of service as Dean and his recent appointment to the newly established “Father Georges Florovsky Distinguished Professorship of Patristics.”

On May 27, Metropolitan Tikhon, President of Saint Tikhon’s Seminary, presided at the school’s 75th annual commencement exercises.
